

- Bundles tied with fiber twine (4' x 2' x 2' limit) - or -
- Rigid cans with handles and lids (32 gal., 60 lb. limit) marked "yard"

NO food scraps allowed in extra yard debris

NO yard debris in plastic bags or recycling carts

To keep your container clean:

- Line with used paper towels, newspaper, shredded paper, or compostable bags.
- Sprinkle food scraps with baking soda to limit odors.
- Freeze or refrigerate food scraps in container or compostable bag until collection day.

Extra Garbage

- There is an additional charge for garbage that does not fit in your garbage cart. If your lid is open more than 6 inches, additional charges incur.
- Put additional garbage in 32-gallon (or smaller) cans or bags.


