DO YOU KNOW HOW TO PROPERLY PREPARE YOUR RECYCLABLES?

Empty any residual food or liquid, clean the container with a quick rinse or scrape, and allow the moisture to dry before tossing in your recycling cart or dumpster. Keep cart and dumpster lids closed to make sure materials stay dry in wet weather.

DID YOU KNOW?



FOOD WASTE AND RECYCLING REQUIREMENT

Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) sections 21.36.082 and 21.36.083 prohibits food scraps, compostable paper, yard waste, and recyclables from going in the garbage.



HAZARDOUS WASTE

Electronics, fluorescent light bulbs and tubes, and other hazardous items are NOT allowed in the garbage. Visit hazwastehelp.org or call 206.263.8899 for safe disposal options.



CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION REQUIREMENT

Construction and demolition materials are NOT allowed in the garbage. Call 206.250.7500 for information on correct construction & demo disposal.



PLASTIC STRAW AND UTENSIL BAN

Plastic spoons, forks, knives and plastic straws are prohibited from Seattle food-service businesses. Instead, food businesses are required to use compostable options. Visit seattle.gov/utilities/greenyourbusiness to learn more.



CLEAR ALLEY PROGRAM (CAP)

The Clear Alleys Program (CAP) replaces dumpsters with a daily bag pickup service, creating cleaner, safer alleys. With CAP you pay by the bag, which means you only pay for what you throw away. Service is available in the Downtown Core and Capital Hill's Pike/ Pine Corridor. Call 206.250.7500 to setup service.
