Secure On Site Paper Shredding	 Recology will accept a maximum of 5 boxes of paper per resident to securely shred on-site Staples and paper clips attached to paper are acceptable as the shredding truck has a magnet that collects metal material
Electronic Waste Recycling	 Recology accepts old/broken laptops, TV's, cellphones, small microwaves, batteries, printers, cables, computers & their components, game consoles, radios/stereos Staff will unload your e-waste material so you do not have to get out of your car!
Compost Giveaway	 Please bring your own Bucket & Shovel to collect your compost For residents using a truck to collect compost, please bring a tarp to cover the compost to avoid excess from spilling or blowing away Each resident may receive up to 32 gallons of compost (due to the limited amount of compost available it is on a first come first served basis)

Have you ever heard the phrase, "one bad apple spoils the bunch?" The same is true for recycling, where one non-recyclable item can spoil an entire batch of otherwise good materials. It may seem like such a small detail—a wrong item in the recycling bin—but it represents a global problem that's preventing thousands of tons of recyclables from being manufactured into new products.

Here's what you can do to help:

- Rinse and wipe clean all empty bottles, cans, paper, plastics
- Leave candy wrappers, chip bags and zip lock baggies out of the recycle cart
- Place food and food soiled paper items into the organics cart and not the recycling cart
- Break down, flatten, and bundle cardboard into piles no larger than 3ft. x 3ft.
- Don't put loose plastic bags into recycling—always bag and tie them together
- Leave hangers and cords out of the recycle container because they damage machinery
- Place clothing in a clear plastic bag next to the blue recycle cart (not inside it)

Environmentally Friendly Homemade Cleaning Recipes!

Surface Disinfectant Recipe	Glass Cleaner	Dusting Spray	Drain Cleaner
½ cup White Vinegar ½ cup Vodka	1/4 cup Rubbing Alcohol 1/4 cup White Vinegar	½ tsp Olive Oil ½ tsp Lemon Essential Oil	1 cup Baking Soda 1 cup Vinegar
1/2 tsp Lemon Juice 10 drops Lavender Essential Oil	2 tbsp Corn Starch2 cups Warm Water	1 cup White Vinegar 3 cups Water	½ tbsp Lemon Juice 1 gallon Hot Water
1 ½ cups Water Put all ingredients into a spray bottle and shake well. Spray all surfaces and let sit for 10 minutes. Wipe clean with a clean cloth.	5 drops Peppermint Essential Oil Pour ingredients into a spray bottle and shake well. Spray surface and wipe with a clean cloth.	Combine all ingredients into a spray bottle. Spray furniture and wipe with a clean cloth.	Pour baking soda down the drain. Slowly pour the vinegar and let sit for 30 minutes. Add lemon juice to the hot water and rinse the mixture away.

These non-toxic recipes made from ingredients you may have at home are a great way to cut down on single-use plastic cleaning supplies

Spring Green Cleaning Tips!

Spring time is here which means packing away that winter clothes, cleaning out those cob webs, and giving the house that well deserved Spring Cleaning! No matter what part of the house you need to tackle, you can find recycling tips and non-toxic household cleaner recipes for every room. The best part about these recipes is that they are made from things you may already have around the house!

Tips:

- Reuse sauce jars as containers for dry ingredients bought in bulk
- Switch out your plastic toothbrush with a bamboo one; once you're ready for a new one the bamboo can be thrown into your green Organics bin and made into compost
- Pour old, unwanted, flat soda into your toilet bowl and let it sit for an hour as a stain remover. Soda is also a great degreaser!
- Use old socks as rags to clean surfaces like fans, vents, and windowsills
