

San Benito County RECYCLING GUIDE

MULTIFAMILY-

Recology San Benito County is proud to work with the Cities of Hollister, and San Juan Bautista and Unincorporated San Benito County to implement new services that will help you meet state mandated programs. These programs will reduce the amount of waste going to the landfill, increase recycling and conserve natural resources. Recycling is easier and more convenient than ever before.

NEW MULTIFAMILY SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Technical Assistance and Training A waste zero team member will provide training and resources to property owners, managers, tenants and maintenance staff to increase recycling, reduce waste and potentially save money
- Organics Collection Multifamily complexes can choose to get organic collection services for food waste and yard waste such as vegetables, fruit, grains, dairy, meat or fish, napkins and paper towels, leaves, grass, prunings, branches, unpainted and untreated wood
 - **Use Compostable Bags** Collect food waste in newspaper, brown paper bag, or approved compostable bag (find a list of compostable bags by visiting www.bpiworld.org) and then place in your green organics cart or bin
- Bulky Item Collection Twice yearly, multifamily complexes can arrange for collection of bulky items and reusable materials at no additional cost
- Free Compost Giveaway Days Compost will be available three times per year
- Electronic Waste and Shredding Events Drop off events three times per year for safely recycling items such as computers, cell phones, and televisions and secure on-site paper shredding service
- Neighborhood Clean Ups When requested, bins will be placed in the community so residents can conveniently discard garbage and recyclables

ORGANICS

YES!

Put these in your Blue Recycle Cart or Bin

- Plastic containers marked Δ - Δ (no Styrofoam)
- Plastic Bags (Grocery, Dry Cleaning, Newspaper bundle together in one clear plastic bag)
- Glass Bottles & Jars (all colors)
- Paper, Cardboard, Paper Egg Cartons, Newspaper, Magazines, Cereal Boxes, Junk Mail, Office Paper
- Metal Food and Beverage Containers, Aluminum Foil, Small Scrap Metal (no cords or chains)
- Aseptic beverage boxes
- All containers must be empty and scraped clean

NO - These items cannot go in your Blue Recycle Cart or Bin

- Food
- Garbage
- Styrofoam
- Toys
- Diapers
- Ceramics, Glassware, Mirrors and Lightbulbs
- Automotive Parts
- Plastic Cords
- Metal Chains
- Household Batteries




O R G A N I C S

YES!

Put these in your Green Organics Cart or Bin

- Food Scraps, Meat/Poultry, Fish, Bones, Fruit, Vegetables, Cheese/Dairy
- Food Soiled Paper such as Pizza Boxes, Napkins, Paper Towels, Plates
- Yard Waste such as flowers, leaves, grass, branches, unpainted and untreated wood

DO NOT put any of your organics in plastic bags. Plastic does not compost, only use compostable bags. (see details below)



- Plastic, Plastic Bags (non-compostable bags)
- Garbage
- Animal Waste
- Sod, Dirt, Rock
- Palm or Poison Oak
- Hazardous Waste



GARBAGE

IDEAS TO MAKE FOOD RECYCLING EASY!

- Ocllect in newspaper, brown paper bag, or approved compostable bag (find a list of compostable bags by visiting www.bpiworld.org)
- 2 Store in a food container with a lid or in the refrigerator or freezer until your service day
- B Take out to your cart daily and make sure your green cart is out for pick-up each week

YES!

Put these in your Gray Garbage Cart or Bin

- Styrofoam Packaging, Food Containers, Packing Peanuts
- Ceramics, Glassware, Mirrors, Window Glass
- Bagged Animal Waste, Diapers
- Snack Bags, Wrappers and Juice Pouches
- Broken Toys
- Clothes Hangers
- Palm or Poison Oak

NO - These items cannot go in your Gray Garbage Cart or Bin

- Electronics
- Medications and Sharps
- Fluorescent Bulbs/Tubes
- Hazardous Waste
- Household Batteries
