

Next Steps:

If any of your self-assessments receive a failing grade, don't worry—this is why we're here to help.

- **1.** The best place to start is by spreading the word on which precise materials are being found out of place. Send out a reminder for where they *should* be going instead. Pictures are always helpful.
- 2. Take note of any purchasing practices that could be changed in order to create more recyclable and compostable items, and fewer trash items. This can help lower the chances of contamination, and potentially lower your bill.
- **3.** Next, take a look at our website. It's full of information and you can even <u>download and print PDFs of</u> <u>our posters</u> to hang onsite.
- 4. Send us an email at <u>customersevice@recologysf.com</u>, or through the <u>Contact Us</u> form on our website. When you reach out, please attach your Self-Assessment form or provide details on the results. Our customer service team will connect you with a qualified Waste Zero Specialist who can provide help for proper sorting and increased diversion from the landfill. All of our educational services are provided at no additional cost to you.
- 5. Waste Zero Specialists can provide multilingual color-coded posters and stickers, conduct multilingual trainings and presentations, or meet onsite to do a walkthrough of the property and identify any opportunities for improved sorting.
- 6. Once you receive outreach from a Waste Zero Specialist, after a few weeks consider repeating the Self-Assessment to gauge how much sorting has improved. You are now eligible for a "pre-audit" of your containers by a Recology Zero Waste Diversion Auditor. This audit will take place before the legislation goes into effect on July 1st, 2019. This audit will give you a good idea of where you stand in terms of compliance. Steps 1-5 MUST BE COMPLETED in order to receive a pre-audit.
- 7. Don't forget that by doing a better job sorting your waste, you're doing a huge favor for our environment. Things that can be reused won't be buried in a landfill, and contamination-free compost and recycling ensures that the material can be processed into something new.
