

Cupertino 2017-2018 SERVICE GUIDE

Steps to make food scrap collection easy!



Place paper bags, clear plastic bags or newspaper in your kitchen pitcher to keep it clean and make it easier to transfer to your organics cart. This will also help soak up any liquids from your food.



Try refrigerating or freezing your food scraps and empty it into your organics cart the night before your service day.

* **New Safety Rules for Household Batteries:** Tape both battery terminals by using masking, electrical, or duct tape to prevent the terminals from coming into contact or rubbing with other terminals or objects that can potentially cause a fire

On Call Collections.....

ON-CALL COLLECTION DAY

Households can select **ONE** of the following twice per year:

- Construction & Demolition Debris
- Bulky Goods
- Compostable Materials and clean wood waste
- Garbage

SET OUT GUIDELINES

- Combination of loose items must fit within an 8-foot long, 4-foot wide and 4-foot high area
- Items left out for pick up must be on private property only (entrance to your driveway) and not in the street or on the sidewalk.
- Single items should not weigh more than 50lbs each or exceed 6ft in length and must be manageable by one person. If items are bagged the bag must be securely closed to prevent litter.

OR CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION

- Debris must be containerized
- Individual boxes not weighing more than 50lbs
- Total weight not to exceed 250lbs

- No pressure treated wood, such as railroad ties

OR BULKY GOODS

- Limit of **3 items** per bulk pick up.
- Bulky goods are items that weigh more than 50lbs or exceed 6ft in length
- Bulky Goods include discarded furniture; carpets; mattresses; household appliances including refrigerators, ranges, washers, dryers, water heaters, and dishwashers. Electronic equipment such as stereos, televisions, computers and VCRs.
- No items with oil, diesel, or gasoline
- No pressure treated wood, such as railroad ties



OR COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS AND WOOD WASTE

- Clean unpainted and untreated wood must be neatly stacked, boxed or in a trash can and cannot weigh more than 50 lbs or exceed 6ft in length
- Branches must be less than 6-inches in diameter
- No stumps, poison oak, or bug infested material accepted
- No loose piles or plastic bags will be collected
- No painted, stained, or pressure treated wood such as railroad ties



To arrange for an on-call pickup, please call our Customer Service Department (408) 725-4020, Monday through Friday during regular business hours. Advance notice of 24 hours is requested. Unused on-call collection days are not transferable from one calendar year to the next.

Coat & Blanket Collection

During the month of December, Recology will be collecting new or gently used coats and blankets, in partnership with a local non-profit organization. Thank you on behalf of the children and adults who will enjoy their warmth through the winter months. Place items in a clearly labeled bag on your regular service day and a Recology employee will collect them. A box will also be available in the City Hall lobby.



Treecycling

During the month of January, Recology will provide free Christmas Tree collection and recycling.

- Please remove tree stands and all decorations, including tinsel. (Flocked trees are acceptable).
- Trees should be cut into 5 ft. lengths. Cut pieces may be placed inside your yard waste cart for service.
- Place trees or carts curbside/roadside on your recycling day.
- Apartment dwellers must place trees in a central location and call to arrange a pickup.
- Trees may be collected by a recycling truck other than the regular yard waste truck.
- If placing a flocked tree out for collection, please sweep up any loose flocking from the ground after collection.

WHAT GOES INTO THE RECYCLE CART?

We accept DRY* plastics, glass, aluminum, mixed paper and cardboard in the blue recycle cart.

YOU CAN RECYCLE:

PLASTICS

- All plastics, with or without symbols, flower pots, bottles, buckets & party cups
- Bubble wrap
- Plastic bags and film plastic

GLASS AND ALUMINUM

- Aerosol cans (empty)
- Aluminum and bi-metal cans
- Aluminum foil (clean, no food)
- Glass bottles and jars (labels and lids are OK)

MIXED PAPER

- Books (paperback and hardcover)
- Cereal, cracker and frozen food boxes (plastic liners removed)
- Envelopes, junk mail, paper bags
- Shredded paper (please put into a paper bag before placing in recycling cart)

CARDBOARD

- Aseptics (paper cartons that include boxed soups, juice boxes and soy containers).
- Cardboard must be flattened to fit inside recycling container with lid closed.



UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR THE RECYCLE CART

Place in Organics Cart:
Food contaminated packaging, paper towels, napkins, tissue

Place in Garbage Cart:
Garden hoses, packing foam peanuts, styrofoam, pet waste



**Please empty all liquids from containers and remove caps before placing in bins.*

WHAT GOES INTO THE ORGANICS CART?

We accept all food scraps, soiled paper, and plants.

YOU CAN COMPOST:

Food Scraps

- Bread, grains and pasta
- Coffee grounds (and filters)
- Dairy
- Eggshells
- Fish and shellfish
- Fruit, including pits
- Meat, including bones
- Poultry
- Vegetables

Yard Trimmings

- Branches and brush
- Flowers and floral trimmings
- Grasses and weeds
- Leaves and tree trimmings

Soiled Paper Products

- Coffee filters
- Milk Cartons*
- Paper cups (including disposable paper coffee cups) and plates
- Paper ice cream containers
- Paper bags, napkins and towels
- Paper take-out boxes and containers
- Paper tea bags
- Pizza Boxes
- Waxed cardboard and paper

**If carton has a plastic spout it needs to be removed and placed in the recycling cart*



UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR ORGANICS YARDWASTE CART:

Place in Garbage Cart:
Ashes

Bio-Degradable Plastics*
Construction & Demolition
Cornstarch Items*
Dirt, Rock, Concrete
Pet & Human Waste

Place in Recycle Cart:
Plastic Bags
Recyclable Items

** Bio-degradable and Cornstarch-based plastics decompose too slowly to compost.*

Door-to-Door Household Hazardous Waste Management Program

Included in your monthly recycling service, household hazardous waste collection such as paint and pesticide, cleaning and fertilizing chemicals. A kit will be mailed to you which includes a bag with a one-way seal. The bag will be picked up at your door as opposed to the curb.
