### Easy Battery Disposal

Customers may easily recycle household batteries. On your collection day, just place your batteries into a clear zip-lock bag, then place the bag on top of your blue recyclables Toter<sup>®</sup>.

#### **Extra Trash Solutions**

Residential customers are given one Landfill Pass each year to self-haul a single load of up to two yards or 1,000 pounds of materials to the **Recology Hay Road** landfill without charge. Electronic waste or recyclable materials should not be included in the materials.

The convenient Residential Clean-up Program (RCP) allows residential customers a single annual curbside collection of one of the following categories: two cubic yards of bagged materials, 2 large appliances, 2 large bulky items, or up to 3 e-waste items.

### Christmas Tree Recycling

Christmas trees that are free of tinsel, flocking, ornaments, and tree stands may always be cut to fit inside the green vardwaste Toter<sup>®</sup>. The Toter<sup>®</sup> lid must be able to close. Trees with these materials may be cut up and placed in your gray residual waste Toter<sup>®</sup> or call for a special pickup.

## Cardboard Box Recycling

Large corrugated cardboard boxes are accepted at the **Recology Recycling Center** at  $855^{1/2}$ Davis Street from Tuesday through Saturday, 9AM until 3PM. Boxes may also be flattened and placed in the blue recyclables Toter® for collection. The lid of the Toter<sup>®</sup> must be able to close.



Winter gives residents time to prepare yards and gardens for spring. There are three options for the collection of additional vardwaste for customers with 96-gallon green Toter® service only. The first option is to rent additional yardwaste Toters<sup>®</sup> from **Recology Vacaville Solano**. The second option is to use your own sturdy 32-gallon cans that have handles and tight fitting lids. The third option is to use twine to tie tree or shrub prunings into bundles that are no larger than 3 feet by 2 feet. There is no extra charge for bundles or for the emptying of extra 32-gallon customer provided cans. Place extra yardwaste cans beside your green Toter<sup>®</sup>. Your green Toter<sup>®</sup> must be set out to use this service. Customers with 32-gallon green Toter® service do not get extra vardwaste collections.

aerosols, fluorescent lighting tubes, gas, herbicides, pesticides, paint, solvents, spa and pool chemicals, thinners, used cooking oil, and other household hazardous waste. Materials are only accepted from residential customers from Vacaville, Dixon, and

unincorporated Solano County. No appointments are necessary. The Electronic Waste Center

accepts two electronic devices per visit. You must be able to lift items from your vehicle and carry them to the drop-off area.

# What can and cannot be recycled?

Below is the list of acceptable and *unacceptable* materials for the blue recyclables Toter<sup>®</sup>. For information about recycling and other services we provide, click recologyvacavillesolano.com or call us at 448-2945.

#### Glass

All beverage and food containers in all colors. Empty container, rinse, and remove lid or cap. No drinking glasses, ceramics, window glass or mirrors, fluorescent tubes or light bulbs.

#### Paper

Newspaper, boxes, bags, cardboard (flattened), clean pizza boxes, magazines, catalogs, glossy paper, phone books, softcover books, shredded paper in paper bags, rinsed milk cartons, rinsed juice cartons, junk mail, envelopes, all colors of office paper.

No hardcover books or binders, soiled papers, food wrappings, napkins, tissues or towels.

#### Plastic

All #1 through #7 narrow-neck bottles (water, soda, and detergent bottles). All California Redemption Value (CRV) containers. All colors. Non-bottle plastic-like toys, trays. Plastic tubs for margarine, butter, yogurt, etc. Empty all containers and rinse.

No cups, garden hoses, etc., plastic bags or Styrofoam, PVC or other piping.

### Metal

Food and beverage cans (aluminum, steel, and tin). Rinse. Clean aluminum pans or foil. Empty aerosol cans. Metal lids from jars.

No electronic or computer equipment, hangers, scrap metal, fuel tanks, propane tanks, etc.

## Check for proper Toter<sup>®</sup> placement





 Toters<sup>®</sup> should be placed out with the wheels touching the curb. The lid should open to the street with the handle in the back.

- Don't block the sidewalk.
- Don't park cars within 5 feet of Toters<sup>®</sup>
- Place Toters<sup>®</sup> 5 feet apart. Put Toters<sup>®</sup> out by 6AM on your
- pickup day. Remove Toters<sup>®</sup> from curb by 6PM ar place them at the side of the house or in the rear yard. According to Municipal Code Chapter 8.10 waste receptacles must be at the side of the house or in rear yard at all other

Recology Hay Road is also an additional drop-off site for used oil and filters. There is no charge to drop off <sup>o</sup>oil and filters to this facility.

Keep Workers Safe Items that are flammable, explosive, or just dangerous to handle must never be placed out for collection. Boat flares, caustic chemicals, fireworks, hypodermic needles, propane tanks, and other dangerous items can explode or catch fire when collected.

Bring antifreeze, auto batteries, fluorescent bulbs, and paint to the Recology **HHW Center.** Place household batteries into a clear zip-lock bag and place on top of your blue recyclables Toter<sup>®</sup> on your regular collection day. Place used motor oil and filters out at curbside next to your blue Toter<sup>®</sup>. Oil and filters must be in containers provided by **Recology** Vacaville Solano.
