



Free Tire Disposal



Coupons are now available from the Regional Waste Management Authority for the FREE disposal of up to 20 auto or light truck tires at one time. Residents of Yuba or Sutter County can receive a coupon by calling (530) 634-6890 between 9:00 am and 12:00 noon or 1:00 pm and 4:00 pm each weekday. Please indicate the number of tires you have when you call. This program is for residential use only-NO BUSINESSES.

Coupons will be distributed while supplies last on a first come, first served basis. Coupons expire one month from the date of issuance. The program is limited to tires filling up to 17 inch diameter rims. Tires do not need to be removed from the rims. If hauling more than 9 tires at one time, the Local Enforcement Agency conditions on the reverse side of the coupon must be completed.

Proper maintenance of your vehicle's tires is the key to driving more miles before purchasing new tires. Proper maintenance is also the key to reducing the number of tires being thrown away.

According to the experts, preventing uneven wear is the key to increasing the life of your tires. The Rubber Manufacturers Association recommends regularly rotating your tires and checking wheel alignment following the schedules specified in the vehicle owner's manual. Owners should get into the habit of checking tire pressure at least once a month when tires are cool and before every long trip and inspecting tires frequently for uneven wear and tread wear. Many tire service centers offer these visual inspections free of charge.

Following the manufacturers vehicle loading recommendations, including baggage carried on top, is also important to prevent uneven wear. Don't forget that towed trailers transfer some of their weight to the towing vehicle.

Not only is proper tire care a safe and economical practice, it is also good for the environment. Storage of tires on private and public property can pose a danger to public health and safety. Stored tires are potentially combustible and can become a breeding ground for rodents, mosquitoes and other insects. Grant funding provided by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle). **CalRecycle** All tires disposed of at Recology Yuba-Sutter facilities are sent to a recycling facility, not to the landfill!


I Got a Tag On My Garbage/Recycling Cart What does it mean?




Celebrate America Recycles Day November 15th

We at Recology Yuba-Sutter want to make you aware of the importance of "Buying Recycled." The Employee Owners of Recology Yuba-Sutter have one objective: to increase recycling efforts and promote the purchase of recycled-content products everyday.

Do you know about Recology Yuba-Sutter's "Sharps" Disposal Program?

"Sharps" are lancets, needles and syringes with needles and should never be placed in garbage or recycling carts or bins. Do you know how and where to safely dispose of your sharps? Home-generated sharps from Yuba and Sutter County residents are accepted at the Yuba-Sutter Household Hazardous Waste Facility located at 134 Burns Drive off of Garden Highway in southern Yuba City on Saturdays (only) from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and at the Marysville Transfer Station at 3001 N. Levee Road off of Highway 20 in Marysville at the Container BuyBack Center Tuesday to Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Loose needles cannot be accepted and containers cannot be returned. Remember to place all sharps in a sharps disposal container or other hard plastic container (not plastic milk jugs or soda bottles), such as an empty laundry detergent bottle. If you don't have a safe container to dispose of your sharps, one quart sharps containers are available to Yuba and Sutter County residents at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility and the Container BuyBack Center at the Marysville Transfer Station. Let Recology Yuba-Sutter help you dispose of your sharps safely!



Sutter County Sheriff's Office Prescription Drug Disposal Program

How should you dispose of old medications? Don't flush your old medications or throw them in the garbage! A confidential drop-off bin for prescription drugs is located inside the Sutter County Sheriff's Office at 1077 Civic Center Blvd. in Yuba City. You may drop off prescription drugs Monday to Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Please leave medicines in their original container and remove prescription labels for privacy. This service is for residential households only. Recology Yuba-Sutter wants to help you keep drugs away from children, prevent overdoses and errors, and protect the environment.
