DO YOU KNOW HOW TO PROPERLY PREPARE YOUR RECYCLABLES?

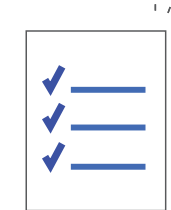

Food waste is NOT allowed in garbage containers in the City of Seattle.

Recycling Requirement

Recycleables are NOT allowed in garbage containers in the City of Seattle.



Hazardous Waste

Electronics, fluorescent light bulbs and tubes, and other hazardous items are NOT allowed in the garbage. Please use safe disposal options:

Construction & Demolition Requirement

Construction and demolition materials are NOT allowed in the garbage.

Straws and Utensils Ban

Plastic spoons, forks, knives and plastic straws are prohibited from Seattle food-service businesses, effective July 1, 2018. Instead, food businesses are required to use compostable options.
