CARTS AND COLLECTION

Carts are used for garbage, organics, and recyclables. Carts are provided by Recology Davis. Full carts may not weigh more than 200 pounds. Please be careful not to exceed weight limits. Fees may be charged for damage to overweight carts.

SENIOR/ DISABLED

BULKY WASTE COLLECTION:

Single-family customers in a household where all inhabitants are 65 years of age or older, or have a disability can receive up to two Bulky Waste Collection service events per year at the curbside at no extra charge to the customer.

LOW INCOME DISCOUNTS:*

Any single-family customer household that has been authorized for low income assistance by Yolo County may qualify for a twenty percent (20%) discount.

ASSISTED SERVICE:*

Disabled residents who have applied for Assisted Service through Yolo County and have been authorized for such collection will receive the following. Drivers shall walk up, retrieve carts from garage or fence line, service carts, and return carts to original location.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Yolo County residents can bring their hazardous waste, electronics, and universal waste to the household hazardous waste (HHW) Drop-Off Days at the Yolo County Central Landfill for free every Friday and Saturday from 7:30am – 3:30pm.



YARD MATERIAL COLLECTION

Yard material piles will be collected the third Thursday of every month.

RULES:

- The organics cart must be full before using the on-street yard material piles.
- Yard material piles may not be set out more than 7 days before a scheduled pick-up day.
- Grass clippings, vines and weeds are not allowed in yard material piles.
- Place yard materials directly in front of the property it came from, not across the street or around the corner—this is illegal dumping and the pile will not be picked up!
- Place yard material piles 18" from the gutter.
- Yard material piles may not be larger than 5 feet in any direction.
- Do not block fire hydrants, driveways or storm drain inlets with yard material piles.
- Do not park or drive over yard materials.
- Do not place bagged yard materials in piles—leave yard materials loose in piles on the street.
