

PROGRESS UPDATE

Foster City is pleased to report significant progress on the Levee Improvements Project! The project team recently marked a significant milestone, with the installation of the final sheet pile in Phase 2 (from Shorebird Park to the San Mateo Bridge). The sheet piles will form the upgraded wall structure in this section of the levee, protecting our community for years to come.

The Baffin Street crossing to Belmont/Redwood Shores is currently projected to close in June, and a detour will route trail users along Port Royal Ave or O'Neil Slough Path, depending on which direction they are coming from.



With the project advancing ahead of the anticipated schedule, the closure of the Levee Trail from the San Mateo Bridge to Anchor Road began April 1, 2021.

The Levee Improvements Project team has been working to provide accommodations for recreational water users' access from Baywinds Park during construction. Through the end of 2021, access to the bay will remain available for recreational water users launching and returning to the park and the beach area (near Lakeside Dr.) only. There will be no shoreline access beyond the beach to the San Mateo Bridge, and no special shoreline return/exit points (except for emergencies) as this section will remain an active construction area.
