STATE LAW AB 341: MANDATORY COMMERCIAL RECYCLING

Requires all businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of waste each week and all multi-family communities with 5 or more units to have recycling service for cardboard, paper, plastics, glass and cans.

STATE LAW SB 1383: SHORT LIVED CLIMATE POLLUTANT REDUCTION STRATEGY

SB 1383 establishes statewide targets to reduce the amount of organic waste disposed of in landfills (50% reduction by 2020 and 75% by 2025). It also sets a goal to rescue at least 20% of currently disposed edible food by 2025 and redirect that food to people in need. 
