Composting & Spring Tips



Organic compost is available now until October 31 at **Recology Hay Road**, weather permitting. Dixon residents who reside in the city limits may haul up to four yards of the organic compost per visit each day at no charge. Show your residual waste bill or other identification at the scalehouse. Compost supply is limited and is also subject to supplies on hand. You must load your vehicle and cover your load of compost.

Dixon Recycling Center The Recology Recycling and Buy-Back Center at the corner of First and C Streets is open Tuesday

through Saturday from 9AM until 3PM. It accepts oil filters; used cooking oil; household batteries; scrap glass; tin food cans; corrugated cardboard; newspaper, mixed paper and shredded paper; and plastic items such as milk jugs. The **Center** pays various amounts for items like aluminum cans; glass (sorted by color); motor oil; and some plastics.

Landlords Check Accounts

Landlords are responsible for the payment of the **Recology** bill for rented property. Bills become delinguent after 75 days. Unsettled debts and fees may be placed as a tax assessment on the owner's property. Delinquent notices are sent quarterly to property owners and tenants with a final delinquent letter sent to the property owner in June. Landlords who are unsure of their tenants' payment status are encouraged to call **Recology Dixon** with the account number and property address to check the outstanding balance.



Spring is here and warm weather has brought about the growth of weeds and plant life. Customers may place out unlimited amounts of extra yardwaste for collection at no extra charge. Only use sturdy 32-gallon cans that have handles and tight fitting lids or rent additional Toters[®] from **Recology Dixon** for this service. Place bundles of tree or shrub prunings that are no larger than 3 feet by 2 feet beside your green Toter[®]. Your green Toter[®] must be set out to use these services.

California businesses and communities are now establishing ways to meet the new regulations. Click recology.com/sb1383/ to learn more about this new law.

at any time. Call 707-635-9041 to make your payment. Have your account number ready and follow the instructions.

Go to *billpay.recology.com* to pay online. Customers may make a one-time payment or create an online account for recurring payments. We accept American Express, Discover, Mastercard, and Visa credit cards, or we can debit your bank account.

Extra Trash Solution

Call us at 707-678-4026 or contact us at *recology.com* at least one day in advance, and we will collect extra trash that does not fit in your gray residual waste Toter[®]. There are extra charges for this service. Call us for complete information or for cost.

Put Leaves in Their Place

Please do not rake leaves or other yardwaste into the street. Homeowners must make sure that commercial gardeners do not rake or blow leaves into the street. Only water should go in the storm drain system.

The following materials are not recyclable. Check website or call for proper disposal

Never Place in the Blue Toter®:

Paper-No hardcover books or binders; soiled papers, food wrappings, napkins tissues or towels, waxed paper milk cartons or waxed paper juice cartons.

Glass-No drinking glasses; ceramics; window glass or mirrors; light bulbs or fluorescent tubes.

Plastic-No plastic toys, cups, garden hoses, etc.; plastic bags; Styrofoam; clam-shell food containers; PVC or other piping.

Metal-No electronic or computer equipment; hangers; scrap metal; fuel or propane tanks, etc.

Bundles, boxes, or bags of materials placed outside of the Toter[®] will not be collected.


