Organic Waste Recycling




Vacaville residents are now able to put more organic materials into their green Toter[®]. These materials will be composted to create

rich organic compost that will enrich farms, gardens, and yards in our area.

In addition to the yard debris and plant clippings, customers may now include food-

soiled paper such as coffee

grounds and filters, pizza boxes, paper food

Food scraps such as fruit, meat, cheese, fish, grains, vegetables, and other food items may also be placed in the green Toter[®].

Just set out your Toters® as usual on your regular collection day. Make sure that only approved food scraps and food-soiled paper are included with the yard waste.

Spring Cleaning Tips

Residential customers are given one Landfill Pass each year to self-haul a single load of up to two yards or 1,000 pounds of materials to the **Recology Hay Road Landfill** without charge. Electronic waste or recyclable materials should not be included in the materials.

The convenient Residential Clean-up Program (**RCP**) allows residential customers a single annual curbside collection of one of the following categories: two cubic yards of bagged materials, 2 large bulky items, or up to 3 e-waste items.

Load Up on Compost Now

Organic compost is available now until October 31 at **Recology Hay Road**, weather permitting. Vacaville residents who reside in the city limits may haul up to four yards of the organic compost per visit each day at no charge. Show your residual waste bill or other identification at the scalehouse. Compost supply is limited and is also subject to supplies on hand. You must load your vehicle and cover your load of compost.

Open for Business!

The Customer Service office at 1 Town Square Place in Vacaville is now open to the public Monday through Friday from 8am until 5pm. We no longer accept cash for payments. Masks are required to enter the office.

Customers are encouraged to pay bills by mail, over the phone, or online. A payment box for checks or money orders is available in front of the office at 1 Town Square Place in Vacaville. Another payment box is located at 235 N 1st Street in Dixon.

Pay-By-Phone is free for customers to use at any time. Call 707-305-1275 to make your payment. Have your account number ready and follow the instructions.

Go to *billpay.recology.com* to pay online. Customers may make a one-time payment or create an online account for recurring payments.

Place either beside your green Toter®. Your green Toter® must be set out to use Extra Yardwaste services.
