BATTERIES AND CELL PHONES

Please place all household batteries and cell phones in the collection area designated by property management.

 Properties can request a free Recology collection bucket to recycle these items.





TEXTILES

Recology collects clean clothing, shoes, and other textiles. Property managers must schedule an appointment for collection of these items, which will be donated or recycled. Items must be collected in a central location.

HOLIDAY TREES

Recology collects holiday trees from December 26 through January 31. Trees must be collected in a central pile.

 Property managers must schedule a collection appointment on behalf of the entire complex.







BULKY ITEMS

Bulky items such as mattresses, furniture, and appliances are not accepted in your regular trash bin. It is illegal to dump or abandon bulky items in the City of Mountain View.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) such as cleaners, pesticides, and propane tanks cannot be disposed of in the trash, recycling, or compost.

Accepted Items—For Free Drop-Off

- Recyclable containers (Bottles, cans, jugs, jars, and cartons)
- Clean and dry paper
- Clean and dry cardboard (Remove packaging and flatten boxes)

✓ LARGE ITEMS—CONTACT FOR AN APPOINTMENT

- Large appliances (No refrigerators, freezers, or air conditioners)
- Mattresses and box springs (Dry and free of pests or mildew)
- Wood and lumber (Unpainted and untreated)
- Furniture (In good condition, limits apply)
- Yard trimmings (No tree stumps or branches over 6" diameter)

OTHER RECYCLABLES—LEAVE WITH ATTENDANT

- Empty aerosol cans (No gas cylinders)
- Household batteries (Tape terminal ends)
- Compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) (No tubes)
- Used cooking oil (Seal in a clear, screw-top container)
- Metal scrap, e.g. pots, pans, tools (Less than 6 feet long)
- Clothing and shoes (In good condition for donation)
- Textiles, e.g. bedsheets, towels, clothing (Must be clean and dry, holes and permanent stains ok)
- Electronic waste, e.g. cell phones, monitors, printers
- Small appliances e.g. microwave, toaster oven (Counter-top sized)

CRV BUY-BACK CENTER

Tuesday to Friday, 12 PM – 4 PM and Saturday, 9 AM – 4 PM

CRV (California Redemption Value)-eligible containers like bottles and cans must be emptied of liquids and sorted by material type prior to arrival. Learn more at Recology.com/MountainView by clicking on "Nearby Locations."

Accepted Items—For Free Drop-Off

- Extra residential recycling
- Fluorescent light bulbs and tubes (Limit 20 total)
- Empty gas cylinders (One-pound size only, limit 3 cylinders)
- Mercury Items (Thermostats, thermometers)
- Paint in original containers (Drop-off Mon-Fri only)

- Sharps, needles, or lancets (In biohazard or hard plastic container with screw-top lid marked "sharps")
- Household and auto batteries (Tape terminal ends)
- Used motor oil, oil filters, and antifreeze (Limit 10 gallons in 5-gallon or smaller plastic containers with screw-top lids)
- Holiday string lights

FREE COMPOST AND MULCH

Limited to 96 gallons of each material per week. Must bring your own shovel and container(s). Call first to check supply.

RE-USE TRAILER

Furniture and other reusable items are available for free to residents.

Redeem California Redemption Value (CRV) bottles and cans. Open to the public. Appointments required.
