Sakata Seed America is a leading producer of vegetable and ornamental seeds, so Waste Zero Specialist Diana Ocampo knew the company would be a good candidate for the Recology South Valley Organics Program.

Sakata Seed's Senior Operations Manager Rhonda Jones and Warehouse Technician Josie Bravo gave Ocampo a tour of their Morgan Hill facility last year. They discussed how to reduce the materials the business sends to landfill.

The company implemented an organics program, installing collection bins for food scraps and other compostables, distributing outreach materials, and

hosting Recology presentations for employees.

MEDICATION AND SHARPS DISPOSAL

Please do not flush prescription drugs or overthe-counter medications down the toilet. Medication does not dissipate completely after passing through wastewater treatment plants.

Medications AND sharps can be dropped off at the Morgan Hill Police Department, 16200 Vineyard Blvd., 8 AM to 5 PM Monday-Friday. Put sharps in a hard-sided container.



DON'T FORGET TO INCLUDE THE FOOD

Yard waste, such as leaves and grass clippings, is a common item to place in your green organics cart. However, don't forget to include the food!

Items such as food scraps, coffee grounds and filters, greasy pizza boxes, paper napkins, and uncoated paper plates can all be placed in your green organics cart.

To receive a free kitchen compost collection container, contact Recology South Valley at 408.842.3358. The collection container is dishwasher safe and has a lid to reduce odor.

WHERE DOES IT GO?

Ever wonder what happens to the materials you place in your green organics cart? Below is a quick overview:

Recology delivers material to the organics processing facility. The 90-day process begins. Material is ground up,

watered, placed into long piles, tested, and screened.



The finished product — nutrient-rich compost!
