The City of Foster City and its City Council are committed to maintaining our local quality of life and supporting the core services and infrastructure that our residents, businesses, and visitors rely on every day.

The City is focused on providing high quality services and reliable infrastructure. Some of the key priorities are maintaining:

- 911 emergency medical, police, and fire response times and services.
- Infrastructure to prevent flooding and other hazards.
- · Clean, safe, and inviting parks and recreation facilities.
- Local streets, pathways, bike lanes, and public sidewalks.
- Foster City's long term fiscal sustainability.

However, the City is faced with fiscal challenges such as stagnant or declining revenues due to unfavorable economic conditions, the state revoking certain local funds, and aging infrastructure.

In order to maintain an acceptable level of service and quality of life, the City is asking residents to provide feedback on their priorities via a community survey and upcoming Town Halls. This input will help the City understand what's most important to the community, and also grant the City an opportunity to share details regarding a potential Business License Tax modernization effort that is being considered to address these mounting financial challenges.

While the potential additional Business License Tax revenue would not completely solve the financial issues the City is facing, it could provide a consistent and stable revenue stream. This would allow the City to continue providing high quality services to the community while exploring other options to maintain its long-term fiscal sustainability. Your feedback will be critical in helping the City determine next steps.
