

JOIN A COMMISSION

The City of Belmont is recruiting residents interested in serving on various City Commissions. The application deadline is Friday, January 10, 2025, at 5 p.m. Interested individuals can apply online at www.belmont.gov/commissions, by calling 650-595-7414, or in person at the City Clerk's Office at One Twin Pines Lane, Suite 330 (appointments suggested). An electronic copy of the application is acceptable to meet the deadline but must be followed by a wet signature copy.

Applicants must live in Belmont. There is no compensation for these positions except for a small stipend paid to Planning Commissioners. Incumbent members of all these commissions are eligible to apply for reappointment.

There are currently two Planning Commission seats, three Parks and Recreation Commission seats, and an additional two youth seats on the Parks and Recreation Commission that are open to applicants.
