akglen Plaza, built in 1997 at the corner of Monterey Road and Wright Avenue, is home to 10 businesses offering customers a variety of services. And now, thanks to Plaza owners Raj and Neena Khanna, the commercial center's tenants participate in recycling and composting programs.

The Khannas contacted Recology after learning about state law SB 1383, which requires food scraps, uncoated foodsoiled paper, and yard trimmings to be

composted. They wanted to ensure the center complied.

René Santos, owner of La Soledad Bakery and La Soledad Mexican Restaurant, worked with Recology Waste Zero Specialist Julie Alter to learn about the composting program. Then, they met with the other Oakglen Plaza tenants to educate them about best practices, such as sorting and signage. Santos also helps manage the center's recycling, organics, and garbage containers.

Ten businesses working together to separate their discards — now that's teamwork!

### **National River Cleanup Day 2025**

oin the fun and be the solution to water pollution by participating locally in this year's National River Cleanup Day. This is a nationwide effort to protect rivers, watersheds, and wildlife from trash and debris.

Since its inception in 1991, more than 1.3 million volunteers have participated in thousands of cleanups across the country, covering more than 261,000 miles of waterways and removing more than 32.5 million pounds of litter and debris.

#### PAINT RECYCLING IS EASY IN MORGAN HILL

The PaintCare program lets you take unwanted paint to local paint stores for recycling. Before dropping off your paint:

→ Make sure that your cans are smaller than 5 gallons, have lids, original labeling, and do not leak.

→ Limit is 20 gallons.


