## Twin Pines Park Belmont Creek Restoration Project

Belmont Creek through Twin Pines Park is unstable and has experienced significant erosion, contributing to downstream flooding. The Belmont Creek Restoration Project will restore almost 500 feet of creek throughout the park. Work includes the removal of invasive plant species, reestablishing native plant and habitat space along the creek, improving creek flow, and enhancing public access to the creek.

## **Project Timeline**



### 2022-Late 2024

Staff attended Concert in the Park events, Parks and Recreation Commission, and City Council to boost awareness of the project while in design.

#### Winter 2024-2025

Over 52 dangerous and invasive trees were removed. In addition to improving safety, many of the trees removed were salvaged and will be used in restoration construction.

#### Summer 2025

Restoration work will
begin in early June and
continue through midSeptember. Access to the
western portion of Twin
Pines Park will be
restricted.
