#### STATE LAW AB 341: MANDATORY COMMERCIAL RECYCLING

Requires businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of garbage each week and multi-family communities of 5 or more units to have recycling service for cardboard, paper, plastics, glass, and cans.

Place all recyclable items loose in your container. Do not bag recyclables.
