RECYCLING MISCONCEPTIONS

STYROFOAM PRODUCTS are not recyclable in curbside programs

because they require highly specialized equipment and, even then, are difficult to process. Foam products can be bulky, lightweight, and easily contaminated with food, tape, and other residues that don't belong in recycling bins. Consult with local shipping companies to see if they'll accept your styrofoam.





PLASTIC BAGS AND FILM are not accepted in most curbside recycling programs. This is because they can tangle sorting machinery and are made with materials that cannot be easily separated. Instead, take these items to designated drop-off points at grocery stores or reuse them whenever possible to reduce waste.





SINGLE-USE PLASTICS.

also known as disposable plastics, are not accepted in your curbside bin. While they feel recyclable, most are either made of hard-to-recycle plastics or are too small to be sorted by machines. When possible, swap them for reusable options.

Whatbin.com is a simple, no-frills tool that helps you figure out which bin your discards belong in — landfill, recycling, or organics — based on your local jurisdiction's rules.

Just type in the item you're trying to dispose of, and it tells you how to sort it, tailored to your city.

It's fast, ad-free, and helpful, especially for tricky items like greasy pizza boxes or used paper towels. It's perfect for anyone trying to waste less, recycle right, or just win the "who sorted it better" debate at home.

What CAN go in your gray bin:

- ✓ Plastic shopping bags
- ✓ Plastic utensils
- Straws
- ✓ Broken glass & dishware
- Wrappers, chip bags, plastic film
- ✓ Styrofoam



TIP: If you're not sure how to dispose of an item, visit **whatbin.com** to find out.

What **CANNOT** go in your gray bin:

- **X** Recyclables plastic tubs, jugs, and containers, glass bottles, metal, cardboard, and paper
- X Organics − grass clippings, tree/brush trimmings, and branches
- ➤ Electronic waste TVs, computers, cell phones, batteries, printers, fluorescent light bulbs, thermometers
- ★ Hazardous waste paint, aerosol or solvent cans, cleaners, pesticides/herbicides, flammables, poisons, fuel canisters/tanks, motor oil
- ➤ Building and automotive waste asbestos, treated wood, antifreeze, tires
- ★ Medical waste needles, sharps, medicines, biohazardous materials

- Flammables, Pesticides, or Herbicides
