TEMPORARY BOXES



Recology offers 3, 10, 20, and 30 cubic yard boxes. You will need an asbestos survey for construction or demolition of all structures built prior to 2004 before a box can be delivered to you. Contact customer service for more information and to order

Recology collects mattresses, appliances, TVs, and more! Service charges and disposal fees apply. Contact customer service for more information.

All carts and containers are the property of Recology. Any additions/alterations to carts or containers by the assigned user will incur charges to cover costs of a replacement container. Contact Customer Service for wind latched carts. Subject to availability.

COLLECTION TIME



Set your cart out by 6 AM on your collection day. Your actual service time may vary from week to week. Many cities require that carts are brought back in within 24 hours after collection to ensure public right of way. This includes sidewalks, driveways, and roadsides.

BATTERY RECYCLING

Improperly discarded household batteries can spark and cause fires when not handled properly, creating dangerous situations for garbage and recycling truck drivers and processing facilities.

SAFE HANDLING: Please tape ends of all batteries, except alkaline, with clear tape. For coin/button cell batteries, wrap tape around the entire battery. If you have multiple hearing aid or other coin/button cell batteries, lay out a long strip of packing tape, place the batteries on the tape—be sure not to let them touch each other—and place another long strip of tape on top. You may drop household, auto, rechargeable batteries off for free at McMinnville Transfer Station.

E-WASTE

Oregon e-cycles is a free recycling program for computers, TVs, and monitors. Drop off items at McMinnville Transfer Station. Limit seven items per visit.


PAINT RECYCLING

All paint sold in Oregon includes a surcharge to fund a collection and recycling program. Visit paintcare.org for details.

Curbside Set-Out

Place carts curbside by 6 AM on your service day. Place 4ft apart and 4ft from all obstacles. Service availability may vary by location. Not all collection services or commodities are available in all service areas.

Lids closed at all times.
Do not overfill.



Side yard carts must be within 40' of curb, outside gates and fences, visible from the street. Other restrictions may apply.

WASTE REDUCTION TIPS

1. Carry a reusable water bottle and refill it often!
2. Take your own mug to the coffee shop.
3. Carry canvas bags when grocery shopping.
4. Buy loose fruits and vegetables.
5. Choose reusable containers to store food and for packing lunches.
6. Refuse single-use plastics when possible.
7. Buy in bulk to eliminate packaging.
8. Shop at stores that resell clothing, furniture, appliances, and tools.
9. Use cloth napkins instead of paper ones.
10. Try to repair broken items before replacing them.

CONTAMINATION-REDUCTION TIPS

1. When in doubt, throw it out — don't guess.
2. Empty, clean, and dry recyclables.
3. No plastic bags, wraps, or film in the recycling cart.
4. Keep batteries, electronics & hazardous items out of carts.
5. Do not bag recyclables — place items loose.
6. No food or liquids in the recycling.
7. Only recycle accepted items — not "wish-cycling."
8. Flatten cardboard to save space and avoid jammed carts.
9. All recyclable items must be larger than 2 inches in two dimensions.
