COMMERCIAL COMPOSTING

All businesses and multifamily buildings are required to have a green composting bin for organic waste.

If you don't currently subscribe to composting services, please call Recology at 650-595-3900.

If your business does not generate any organic waste, apply for a waiver at RethinkWaste.org/Waiver.

Businesses that do not subscribe for compost or apply for a waiver will receive a notice of violation with future penalties.

Attention Property Managers:

California Mandate (SB 1383) Requires Apartments, Condos and Townhouses to Compost

Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) is a law enacted by the State of California to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants. The law seeks to achieve a 75% reduction in the statewide disposal of organic waste.

HOW DOES THIS AFFECT YOUR PROPERTY?

Due to State Law, all generators are now required to place food scraps, food/beverage soiled paper products, and yard trimmings in the green compost bin or self-haul all compostable material to a composting facility or program. **Jurisdictions have the authority to assess a fine for non-compliance.**

Why Compost?

FIGHTS CLIMATE CHANGE

Composting food scraps and soiled paper products diverts those materials from the landfill, where they would otherwise decompose and produce methane – one of the most potent greenhouse gases in Earth's atmosphere. When placing compostable material in the compost bin, you are avoiding methane emissions and giving organics a valuable second life as compost, which helps to fight climate change.

IT'S THE LAW

SB 1383 requires all generators to actively participate in a compost program, placing food scraps and food/beverage soiled paper products into the green compost bin for collection and processing.



In San Mateo County, **1/3** of materials in the landfill are compostable material.
